Area Agency on Aging #11

The Area Agency on Aging (AAA) is a legislated overseeing body within the Aging and Community Services Division of San Joaquin County Human Services Agency. The Board of Supervisors and Area on Agency staff are assisted and guided by the Commission on Aging, which serves as an Advisory Board.

Our local Area Agency on Aging is seated within the structure of the Aging and Community Services Division of the Human Services Agency. The positioning of the AAA in the county service system increases the ability to deploy resources for seniors as a single point of entry, optimizing service delivery.

The Area Agency on Aging funding includes federal dollars through the Older Americans Act with matching State Funding. The funding is distributed through contracts with service providers and direct services provided by the Aging and Community Services.

Every four years, the AAA sets out a plan and creates goals for the next period, currently 2024-2028. Information is gathered through countywide surveys, outreach, input and contact with the communities and residents to determine the needs of the county.

In the goals set forth for the current plan, the Area Agency on Aging will:

Advocate and provide leadership for the older and functionally impaired older adults.

Provide information and education in the community to aid individuals and their families, health professionals, providers of social services, and link older adults and caregivers to appropriate services.

Continue to improve the safety and protection of older adults through advocacy and addressing issues of abuse by providing services to victims.

Continue to address the needs of caregivers, which are essential in maintaining the needs of the care receiver.

Promote and develop programs that prevent and provide alternatives to institutionalization.

Commission on Aging

The Commission on Aging (CoA) is the advisory body to the San Joaquin County Board of Supervisors on all matters affecting older adults in San Joaquin County. The Commission serves as an advisory body to the Area Agency on Aging regarding the administration of Older Americans Act Title III funding for the contracted services, as well as advocate for older adults' issues.

The Commission on Aging Mission Statement:

To provide guidance, education, and advocacy on issues that relate to older adults of San Joaquin County.

To provide Leadership at the local level in developing systems of home and community-based services.

To assist our diverse population to live with independence and dignity in their homes and community.

The COA is composed of twenty-three members, primarily older adults. The Board of Supervisors (BOS), City Councils and the community at large appoint the commissioners to three-year terms. Ten members are appointed by the BOS: 5 members- 1 from each District, 4 members At-Large; one (1) member appointed by each of the following City Councils: Stockton, Lodi, Tracy, Manteca, Ripon, Escalon, Lathrop, and Mountain House; and 3 representatives of agencies serving older adults: Area Agency on Aging Service Provider, Health Care Provider Organization, and Long-Term Care Ombudsman. A demonstration in the interest of matters affecting older adults and being a San Joaquin County resident are the requirements to be eligible for the Commission.

The structure of the Commission includes elected officers: Chairman, First Vice-Chairman and second Vice-Chairman; elected representatives for the California Senior Legislature and Subcommittees. Meetings are held on the first Monday of the month at 1:30 p.m., with the exception of August when no meeting is held. If a meeting falls on a legal holiday, it is held on the following Monday.

About In-Home Supportive Services (IHSS)

The In-Home Supportive Services (IHSS) program is a federal, state, and locally funded program designed to assist those eligible aged, blind, and disabled individuals who, without this care, would be unable to remain safely in their own homes. IHSS provides services according to the client's ability to perform daily activities, and can include feeding, bathing, dressing, housekeeping, laundry, shopping, meal preparation and clean up, respiration, bowel & bladder care, moving in and out of bed, rubbing the skin (to prevent skin breakdown), accompaniment to medical appointments, paramedical services, and protective supervision.

IHSS clients are responsible for locating their own care providers, for hiring and supervising their providers, and for firing the provider if the services are not performed according to the client's specifications. The San Joaquin County Public Authority for IHSS maintains a Registry of individuals available to work as care providers.

Who qualifies for IHSS?

To be eligible for IHSS, you must be on Medi-Cal; blind, disabled, or 65 years of age or older; AND be unable to live at home safely without help.

IHSS Social Workers determine if you qualify for IHSS by assessing your functional need for specific services, and by identifying the amount of time to be allotted for the performance of services. Depending on the amount of your monthly income, you may be required to pay a share of cost for these services.

Protecting Older and Dependent Adults

Protecting older and dependent adults is increasingly challenging as our older adult population is growing rapidly and many are being cared for in their own homes. Substantial numbers of older and disabled adults are being cared for by their adult children and spouses, which at times creates challenges for all family members.

Older adult abuse is not a new problem. However, conditions in our society now encourage a closer examination of this problem.

Adult Protective Services (APS) program is the first defense to protecting our Older and Dependent Adults.

DEFINITIONS: As Defined by Adult Protective Services

Older Adult: Persons 60 years of age or older.

Dependent Adults: Persons 18-59 who have physical or mental limitations that restrict their ability to carry out normal activities or to protect their rights. **To make a Child Protective Services report for children under the age of 18 call 209-468-1333**

Abuse: Physical abuse, neglect, self-neglect, financial abuse, abandonment, isolation, abduction, or other treatment resulting in physical harm, mental suffering, or deprivation by a care custodian or other person of influence.

TYPES OF ABUSE:

Abandonment: Desertion or willful forsaking of an elder or dependent adult by anyone having care or custody, under circumstances in which a reasonable person would continue to provide care and custody.

Active Neglect: Intentional failure to fulfill care giving obligations; infliction of physical or emotional stress or injury; abandonment; denial of food, medication, personal hygiene, etc.

Financial Exploitation: Illegally or unethically exploited by using funds, property, or other assets of an older person for personal gain, etc.

Passive Neglect: Unintentional failure to fulfill a care-taking obligation; infliction of distress without conscious or willful intent, etc.

Physical Abuse: Infliction of physical pain or injury; continual deprivation of food or water; sexual assault / battery, or rape; confinement; the use of physical or chemical restraint (over or under medicating).

Psychological Abuse: Infliction of mental anguish by demanding, name-calling, insulting, ignoring, humiliating, frightening, threatening, isolating, etc.

Self-neglect: Not providing oneself with adequate food, clothing, shelter, medication or medical care, and/or not allowing others to assist with the provision of such necessities.

Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program

A Long-Term Care Ombudsman is an advocate for residents living in nursing homes and / or residential care facilities for the elderly.

Ombudsman representatives are trained to:

- Receive & investigate complaints on behalf of residents including allegations of abuse or neglect.
- Visit facilities regularly to resolve complaints / concerns.
- Witness Advanced Health Care Directives & Property Transfers for residents in nursing homes.
- Work with licensing agencies and community partners to resolve problems.
- Provide information to residents, families and facility staff.
- Provide education to community groups.
- Offer in-service training to facility staff.
- Work with residents' and family councils.
